Dear Parents or Guardians,

The Junior Ranger Program has been developed to maximize you and your child's enjoyment of Louisiana's State Preservation Areas and State Parks. We hope that you all will have a great time and maybe learn a thing or two while completing this book.

The rules are simple. You and your child (seven or older) must go through the book in numerical order completing each task presented to you. Each activity corresponds with a page in this book. As your child completes each activity he or she will fill out the page.

Here is a brief list of the steps your child must take in order to become a Junior Ranger:

1. Attend three (3) Interpretive Programs
2. Write and draw about experiences during these programs (pg. 3).
3. Present to his/her class or other group what he/she has seen and done to date (pg. 4).
4. Participate in a community service project and recruit two (2) volunteers to help (pg. 5).
5. Complete all other activities in the Junior Ranger book.

When all is complete, you and your child will present the completed Junior Ranger book to the Interpretive Ranger at any one of the sites listed on the back cover. Your child will then become an official Louisiana Office of State Parks Junior Ranger. He or she will be presented with a Junior Ranger patch and certificate.
